OPI Nominated for Prestigious Lamar Medal

Dr. Walter V. Wendler, president of West Texas A&M University, nominated Opportunity Plan, Inc. to receive the Mirabeau B. Lamar Award presented by the Council of Public University Presidents and Chancellors, Independent Colleges and Universities of Texas and Texas **Association of Community** Colleges. The award recognizes distinguished service to Texas higher education above and beyond service to a single institution or system, to include outstanding support of two or more higher education sectors.

In his nomination, Dr. Wendler said OPI's "model of working to individually attend to the needs of each student and provide the means available to attain postsecondary educational objectives ... is truly a Texan plan that blends the abilities of individuals with the resources and support of public and private funding. This kind of innovation is exactly what Texas higher education should pursue statewide. The holistic view of student need as an opportunity to study should be a national model."

The 2018 award will be presented in January. Past Lamar Medal recipients include former WTAMU president and Texas A&M System Chancellor Dr. Barry B. Thompson, Lt. Governor Bob Bullock and U.S. Congresswoman Barbara Jordan.

Learning To Make Wise Investments in Education

Financial aid education is important for students and families preparing for postsecondary education. OPI is on a mission to provide more education throughout the region.

"It is vital for students and their families to view higher education as a wise investment," M. Keith Brown, OPI executive director, said. "Wise investments include a healthy return, and borrowing too much money for an education doesn't provide that."

OPI has conducted Paying for College workshops to more than 600 individuals this fall. The seminar includes information on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and scholarship availability. The presentation also includes tips and pointers for what scholarship committees seek when determining scholarship recipients.

"OPI reviews close to 1,000 scholarship applications each year, and I sit on other scholarship committees as well," Brown said. "If these students hear what we look for in an outstanding application, their chances of securing funding are even better."

Most of the presentations have been to seniors at high schools, such as Texline, Canyon and Palo Duro. OPI has also begun partnering with organizations outside schools, such as Olive's Door in Canadian and the Education Credit Union in Amarillo, to spread the message.

"Education Credit Union is committed to providing practical money management lessons to our members," Roman Fox, ECU educator, said. "We felt teaming with OPI just reinforced both missions and encouraged our members to think more comprehensively about financing higher education."
